he following is why dirty politics and conspiracies and corrupt schemes in high places can never long prevail and why the righteous should not fret at the prosperity of the wicked. God's people are to trust in their God and do good and wait for Him, for He is the King who ruleth over all.

Those who cannot do this should not profess to have faith in Christ and should admit that they don't really obey the Bible.

To do good in this present age is to focus on Christ's Great Commission until He comes for His bride. This is how we "do good" today. This is the business that Christ taught, repeated, and emphasized after the resurrection (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:44-48; John 20:21; Acts 1:8).

I have seen the wicked in great power, and spreading himself like a green bay tree. Yet he passed away, and, lo, he was not: yea, I sought him, but he could not be found" (Psalm 37:34-36).

The verb "passeth" is present indicative. The present tense is a continuous tense, and the indicative mood "asserts something which is occurring while the speaker is making the statement." So the world is passing at this time. This present world system seems to be permanent, but it is even now in the process of passing away. That's what God says. But he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever. God holds the reins. He is using this present world system for His eternal purpose, and it will be finished exactly when God decides, to be replaced by Christ's kingdom.

The prophet Daniel described the end of this present world system. In the dream given to Nebuchadnezzar, it was depicted as a great image of a man representing the ruling empires of Babylon, Persia, Greece, and Rome (Daniel 2:31-35).

Daniel's interpretation explains that Rome continues in various forms until the return of Christ, at which time the world system will be crushed and replaced with Christ's righteous kingdom. "Thou sawest till that a stone was cut out without hands, which smote the image upon his feet that were of iron and clay, and brake them to pieces. Then was the iron, the clay, the brass, the silver, and the gold, broken to pieces together, and became like the chaff of the summer threshingfloors; and the wind carried them away, that no place was found for them: and the stone that smote the image became a great mountain, and filled the whole earth" (Daniel 2:34-35).

Bible commentator Robert Lenski says, "The world is now in the act of passing away. It is its very nature not to last. Its doom is overtaking it. Its glory is fading, its flowers are withering, its promises are failing, its hopes are crumbling. Isa. 14:11. ... Does the siren voice of the world tickle your ears? Hear the word of truth: 'The world is passing away!' The bank is breaking, it was never solvent--will you deposit in it? The foundation is tottering, it was never solid but only sham--will you build on it? The mountain is rumbling, quaking, it was never anything but volcanic, ready to blow off its head at any time--will you build your city there?"



DANIEL DETAILS CONFOUND THE CRITICS

The following is excerpted from Bill Cooper's The Authenticity of the Book of Daniel (2012).

Bill Cooper (1947-2021) was a prolific writer and speaker, with a gift of cutting through the fog of biblical criticism to defend the infallible, plenary, verbal inspiration of Scripture, the six-day creation, and the Masoretic Hebrew and Received Greek texts.

He was a council member of the Creation Science Movement and the Tyndale Society and an adjunct professor for the Institute for Creation Research's Master Faculty.

His most popular book is *After the Flood*, which gives evidence for the historicity of Genesis 10 based on ancient, little known British and European genealogies.

He published a series of books entitled "The Authenticity," which included The Authenticity of the Book of Genesis, Joshua, Judges, Esther, Daniel, Jonah, the Gospels, Acts, the Epistles, and Revelation. In The Forging of Codex Sinaiticus, Cooper gave evidence to support his thesis that Sinaiticus (on which is built the modern English Bible translations) is a forgery.

Cooper was a careful researcher, an independent thinker, and a brave defender of God's eternal truth. He accomplished this in spite of suffering serious illnesses, including leukemia, the last two decades of his life.

We can't agree with all of his conclusions; at times he seems to be dogmatic when the evidence isn't absolute; there is an occasion or two when he might have been led astray by Jewish mysticism; but everything we have read from his pen is well worth considering.

If you want to be encouraged in your faith in the divine inspiration of Scripture, read Bill Cooper.

Not all of his books are currently available in print, but all of them are available in Kindle format from Amazon.

To confound them [Bible critics] though, there are many small, almost unnoticeable, items of internal evidence within the Book of Daniel which tell plainly of its antiquity, and which no forger would have thought of, no matter how 'pious' or well-intentioned he may have been.

Daniel 10:4 contains one such: "And in the four and twentieth day of the first month, as I was by the side of the great river, which is Hiddekel...." The use of the name Hiddekel is most interesting. The Persians knew that river as the Tigra, and Greeks knew it as the Tigris. No post-Persian Greek-speaking Maccabaean forger of Daniel would have used the river's ancient Hebrew name.

Daniel 5:2 contains another powerful indicator of early authorship: "Belshazzar, whiles he tasted the wine, commanded

to bring the golden and silver vessels which his father Nebuchadnezzar had taken out of the temple which was in Jerusalem; that the king, and his princes, his wives, and his concubines, might drink therein."

The Lord is in the detail here. Notice how women were allowed to be present and to partake of royal feasts under the Babylonians. That was never allowed under the Persians. Women were banished to their own quarters. The Book of Esther records that fact.

The mathematics of the Book of Daniel is another indicator of the 6th-century BC authorship of the book. In Daniel 3:1, the writer describes in sexagesimal dimensions the image which Nebuchadnezzar set up on the Plain of Dura (of which more later).

The Babylonians used a sexagesimal system of mathematics.

But how would our Maccabaean forger have known this? The Persians and Greeks had for 400 years past used the decimal system, the same one that we use today. The sexagesimal system would have been entirely unknown to him. In Daniel 8:2, we are told, "...I was at Shushan in the palace, which is in the province of Elam..." The curious thing here is that Shushan belonged to Elam in Babylonian times and even earlier, but not in the 2nd century BC, nor in the preceding three centuries. Then it was considered to belong to, and indeed was, the capital of the province Susiana.

There are many other indicators in the Book of Daniel showing a 6th-century BC authorship, along with a most intimate knowledge of Babylonian culture and affairs. We shall be considering more of them as we proceed. Suffice it here to say that such points as we have considered are entirely ignored by the critics, or are passed over without comment.
